

# THREE PERMACULTURE JOURNALS, BACK ISSUES

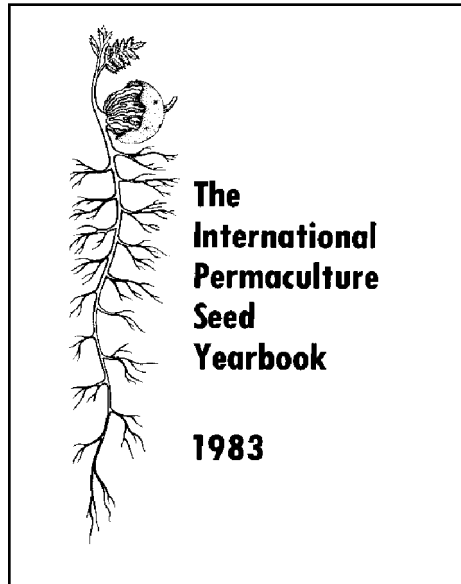
## We have ample copies of most issues. Each is an invaluable classic.

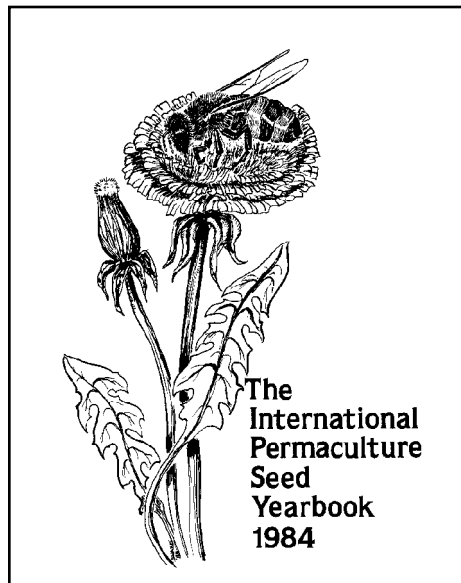

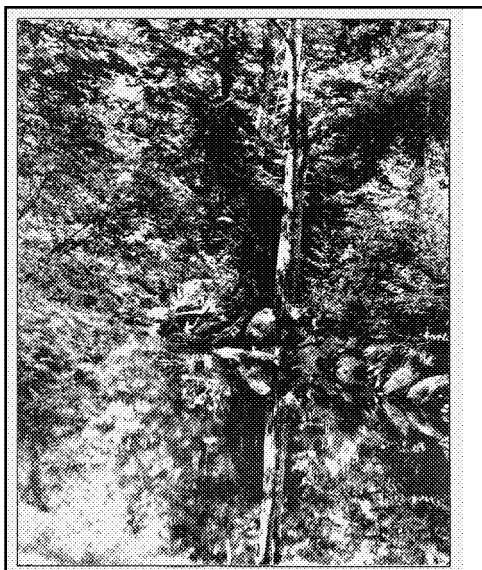

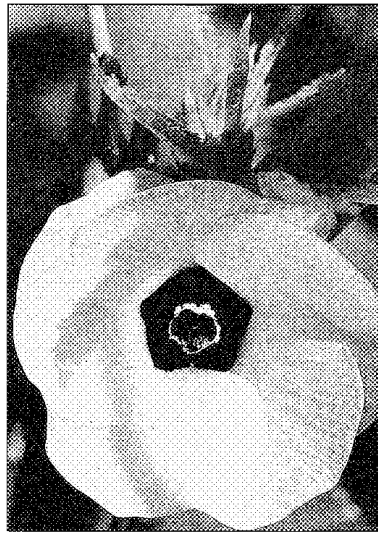
